Accessible, evidence-based loss and grief information and resources for South Australians.

GriefLink provides:

 - Grief after the death of someone close
 - The role of the Coroner
- * listings of resources such as books and videos
- * listings of bereavement services and supports in South Australia for self and professional referral
- * links with other information sources and organisations
- * links to other grief-related sites
- * a quiz for site users to test their knowledge about grief

The GriefLink Website:

The information on the site has been compiled, developed and reviewed by a broad range of professionals and consumers in South Australia with knowledge and experience in the area of loss and grief. International codes of conduct for web sites providing health information were used as a basis for its development.

The content, format and design of the site have been evaluated by key stakeholders, members of the SA community and health and welfare professionals. Information on the site is constantly updated through community input.

All supports and resources listed on GriefLink are assessed and approved by the Management Committee (according to specific criteria) before addition to the site, to ensure that the information provided is appropriate, accurate and timely.

GriefLink is maintained by a Management Committee which meets regularly to oversee the ongoing development of the website. Members are drawn from the University of Adelaide and Flinders University; the Palliative Care Council SA (PCCSA), Minimisation of Suicide Harm Australia (MOSH) and Anglicare. All members participate in GriefLink on a voluntary basis.
